#### "CROWN HIM LORD OF ALL"

One of the greatest hymns of the Church is "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name," and each stanza of that hymn ends with the refrain: "Crown Him Lord of All." What a joy it is to sing, "All hail the power of Jesus' name..." Jesus, Who has secured our forgiveness and salvation, deserves to be crowned Lord of all. Someone has correctly pointed out that, unless we crown Christ "Lord of all," we cannot crown Him Lord at all.

However, because of our sinful nature, we refuse to crown Jesus Lord of all. Instead, we believe that we are the ones who deserve to wear the crown. Most of us have heard the phrase "We have met the enemy, and he is us." We live in opposition against God, and we have this inborn desire to do things our way and for ourselves. We are the king and master of our lives. One of my favorite authors, G.K. Chesterton wrote, "Of all horrible religions the most horrible is the worship of God within." The Holy Spirit's on-going work is to rescue us from ourselves. Through the help of the Holy Spirit, we see how foolish and wrong it is to make ourselves the god of our lives, and we are led to repentance.

In speaking to His disciples and now to us, Jesus said, "If anyone would come after Me let him deny himself and take up his cross" (Matthew 16:24). Denying ourselves is an essential part of crowning Jesus Lord of all. The Pocket Bible Dictionary defines self-denial as, "Voluntary limitation of one's desires, a requirement of Jesus of His followers. Paul also urged Christians to make an offering of themselves to God As followers of Jesus, we are called to reject our natural inclination to follow (Romans 12:1)." our will rather than God's. With God's help, we can overcome the persistent demands from our carnal selves and bring them into submission to God's Word. In the words of Paul, "And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires" (Galatians 5:24). Only by God's grace and the power of the Holy Spirit can we learn to deny self.

When the Holy Spirit helps us to crown Jesus Lord of our lives, we will use our time, talents, and money in ways that honor Him. We are enabled to understand that our lives, gifts, and blessings are from God, and we express our gratitude to Him

for making us part of His kingdom by using what we've been given in service to others.

We close with the final stanza of "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name."

Oh, that with yonder sacred throng We at His feet may fall!
We'll join the everlasting song
And crown Him Lord of all.

## **NEHLM UPDATE**

## Greetings,

Thursday, July 27th, Bob Wingfield, representing the Kurt Marquardt Foundation, will be visiting Rev. Daniel Paul at La Maison des Agneaux de Dieu Orphelinat (MADO--The House of the Lambs of God Orphanage). The Kurt Marquardt Foundation was set up to support Haitian men as they are being educated to be pastors. There is a desire to build a seminary and/or possibly have a few "satellite" sites. This is exciting for the Haitian Lutheran Church and for Rev. Paul.

Typhoid has continued to be a concern for people in Haiti. MADO has been recognized as a facility that has provided care in the past, and the government wants to support MADO to continue to serve. A couple of young ladies of the ministry have some nursing training; we will see what happens with this opportunity.

Nord Est Haiti Lutheran Mission (NEHLM) president Ernie Frederickson and I are scheduled to fly to Santiago, Dominican Republic, August 8-11, to have meetings with Rev. Daniel Paul and Rev. Yves Thelemarque (Headmaster of the school and pastor to the Baja church). Lord willing, Rev. Paul's daughter Sarai will return with me to attend Eastern Oregon University this fall while living with my wife and me. NEHLM normally promotes their higher education in Haiti; a few have gone to the Dominican Republic. This opportunity for Sarai is a gift to the Rev. Daniel and Cliney Paul family which we trust will enhance NEHLM's ability to exchange communications (thank you, sponsors, we have already received some cards). We also desire her presence in the states to be shared with others as we are able. Let me know if you are interested in hosting a presentation, and we will check feasibility.
